

# WHAT IS GPP?

Green Public Procurement is about the public sector choosing more sustainable products and services

In Ireland, public procurement is worth more than €20 billion each year

From major infrastructure investments, through to small local deliveries, each contract has an environmental impact

#### **IRELAND'S COMMITMENTS**



Ireland has committed to reducing greenhouse gas emissions by

51% by 2030, and reaching net zero by 2050

Public bodies must deliver a

50% improvement in energy-efficiency by 2030

Under the <u>Buying Greener Strategy</u> and <u>Circular 17/2025</u>, all tenders valued above €50,000 (or €200,000 for works) must include **green criteria** 

Other targets apply in specific sectors, e.g. a minimum of 10% by value of food procured in public contracts to be certified organic under the Public Sector Climate Action Mandate

#### **EU LAW & POLICY**

EU public procurement rules allow environmental considerations to be included at each stage of a tender

For some purchases, public bodies must apply minimum environmental criteria, e.g. energy-using products, batteries, buildings and vehicles

EU GPP criteria based on life-cycle assessment studies have been adopted for 20 product/service categories

There is increasing focus on **circular economy** considerations, e.g. in the Ecodesign regulations

## **ABOUT GPP**

GPP is about specific actions which suppliers and service providers take in delivering public contracts

GPP criteria are designed to be fair to all bidders – and require proof of the green claims made



GPP **isn't about** green marketing or general corporate commitments



#### **EXAMPLE: GPP IN ACTION**

Bus Éireann implemented GPP in a tender for vehicle cleaning and auxiliary cleaning services, across locations throughout the country

Market consultation held in advance of the tender to ensure sustainable services were available

EPA GPP Guidance and Irish GPP Criteria for Indoor Cleaning
Services were used to set criteria relating to staff training, sustainable products/equipment and waste segregation

15% of the marks at award stage available for these measures

Smart dose technology and compact high dilution products has resulted in reduced use of chemicals, plastic and cardboard which has saved approx. 3580 kg of GHG emissions

### **EPA GUIDANCE ON GPP**


Updated in 2024 to reflect legislation and best practice for GPP

Food and catering services

#### **IRISH GPP CRITERIA**

Detailed criteria covering 11 priority product and service groups

Based on EU GPP criteria, with some adjustments to reflect the Irish market

#### WHAT DO THE CRITERIA INCLUDE?

Specifications, selection and award criteria and contract performance conditions

Relevant standards, legislation, certifications and ecolabels

Verification clauses – stating the evidence bidders need to provide





#### **GPP & THE CIRCULAR ECONOMY**


Circular economy is about moving away from the 'take-make-use-waste' model by maintaining the value of resources

GPP criteria address the entire life-cycle, e.g. raw materials, manufacturing and processing, use phase and end-of-life

#### **EXAMPLES:**

The <u>ICT criteria</u> include requirements for rechargeable battery performance, repairability and design for disassembly

The <u>food and catering services criteria</u> include requirements for organic and sustainable production, packaging and redistribution of excess food





#### WHAT YOU SHOULD EXPECT IN TENDERS

**Exclusion grounds** will include breaches of applicable environmental law

**Selection criteria** may ask for evidence of environmental management systems, supply chain management systems, previous experience, technical capacity and staff training/qualifications

**Technical specifications** will set minimum environmental requirements

Award criteria may target enhanced environmental performance

Contract performance clauses will enforce the environmental aspects and set requirements for monitoring and reporting



#### **HOW TO PREPARE**

Ask your public sector clients about how they are implementing GPP

Keep up to date with developments at EU level, including <u>new</u> <u>editions of the GPP criteria</u> and <u>changes to legislation</u>

Consider how you will demonstrate compliance with GPP criteria in the sector(s) in which you operate

Invest in relevant training and independent certification to demonstrate your firm's green credentials

Measure the environmental impacts of your activities and set targets to reduce them
