

WHAT IS GPP?

Green Public Procurement is about the public sector choosing more sustainable products and services

In Ireland, public procurement is worth more than **€21 billion each year**

From major infrastructure investments, through to small local deliveries, each contract has an environmental impact

A breakdown of public sector procurement spending by product and service category can be found in the *Public Service Spend and Tendering Analysis Report* (Office of Government Procurement). Note that this does not include all public sector procurement, only the addressable spend which falls within the remit of the OGP and the Central Purchasing Bodies (CPBs) for Health, Education, Local Government and Defence. 53% of the analysed spend for 2018 was with SMEs.

EU LAW & POLICY

EU public procurement rules allow environmental considerations to be included at each stage of a tender

For some purchases, public bodies must apply minimum environmental criteria, e.g. **energy-using products, buildings and vehicles**

Under EU Green Deal mandatory GPP will be introduced in some areas, e.g. **batteries**

There is increasing focus on **circular economy** considerations, e.g. in the Ecodesign regulations

ABOUT GPP

GPP is about specific actions which suppliers and service providers take in delivering public contracts

GPP criteria are designed to be fair to all bidders – and require proof of the green claims made



GPP **isn't about** green marketing or general corporate commitments



EXAMPLE: GPP IN ACTION

The Office of Public Works commissioned an environmental impact assessment for its furniture procurement

Specifications, award criteria and contract performance clauses were developed to address a range of impacts e.g. legal and sustainable timber, adhesives, finishes, emissions and waste

There was no increase in costs and suppliers adopted practices in their other business, leading to some cost reductions

The furniture was delivered wrapped in blankets rather than plastic packaging; general switch from acid- to water-based lacquers

CASE STUDY

EPA GUIDANCE ON GPP

Fully updated in 2021 to reflect legislation and best practice for GPP

Explains concepts such as market engagement, needs assessment, GPP criteria and life-cycle costing

Includes advice on implementing, monitoring and reporting on GPP

Suggests what type of evidence to request from bidders and contractors

Gives overview of environmental impact of 12 product/service sectors and includes criteria sets on 10 priority sectors



The EPA guidance on GPP (second edition) was published in September 2021 and can be accessed at: www.epa.ie/publications/circular-economy/resources/green-public-procurement.php

It was drafted with input from the Office of Government Procurement, Sustainable Energy Authority of Ireland, Department of the Environment, Climate and Communications, and other stakeholders. A consultation on the draft guidance was held with supplier bodies, environmental organisations and public sector purchasers. Training on GPP has been delivered to over 100 public bodies through an EPA-sponsored programme.

The environmental impacts addressed go beyond carbon and energy, including e.g. water consumption and impacts on biodiversity/land use.

Road transport vehicles and services



Indoor and outdoor lighting



ICT products and services (including data centres)



Heating equipment (including boilers, cogeneration, trigeneration and heat pumps)




Food and catering services



Energy-related products (white goods/appliances, electronic displays, vacuum cleaners)



Cleaning products and services



Paper products and printing services



Design, construction and management of office buildings



Textile products and services (including uniforms and laundry services)

IRISH GPP CRITERIA

Detailed criteria covering 10 priority product and service groups

Based on EU GPP criteria, with some adjustments to reflect the Irish market

WHAT DO THE CRITERIA INCLUDE?

Specifications, selection and award criteria and contract performance conditions

Relevant standards, legislation, certifications and ecolabels

Purchasing recommendations for electricity and professional services

GPP & THE CIRCULAR ECONOMY

Circular economy is about moving away from the 'take-make-use-waste' model by maintaining the value of resources


GPP criteria address the entire life-cycle, e.g. raw materials, manufacturing and processing, use phase and end-of-life

EXAMPLES:

The ICT criteria include requirements for rechargeable battery performance, repairability and design for disassembly

The food and catering services criteria include requirements for organic and sustainable production, packaging and redistribution of excess food

WHAT YOU SHOULD EXPECT IN TENDERS

Exclusion grounds will include breaches of applicable environmental law

Selection criteria may ask for evidence of environmental management systems, supply chain management systems, previous experience, technical capacity and staff training/qualifications

Technical specifications will set minimum environmental requirements

Award criteria may target enhanced environmental performance

Contract performance clauses will enforce the environmental aspects and set requirements for monitoring and reporting



HOW TO PREPARE

Ask your public sector clients about their plans to implement GPP

Keep up to date with developments at EU level, including **new editions of the GPP criteria** and **changes to legislation**

Consider how you will demonstrate compliance with GPP criteria in the sector(s) in which you operate

Invest in relevant training and independent certification to demonstrate your firm's green credentials

Measure the environmental impacts of your activities and set targets to reduce them
