

Site Visit Report

Under the *European Union (Drinking Water) Regulations 2023*, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is the supervisory authority in relation to Uisce Éireann and its role in the provision of public drinking water supplies. This audit was carried out to assess the performance of Uisce Éireann in providing clean and wholesome water to the public water supply named below.

The audit process is a sample of the performance of a water treatment plant and public water supply on a given date.

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Summary of Key Findings

- 1. The audit found that booster chlorination at Thomastown Reservoir was operating satisfactorily on the day of the audit with good management systems in place.
- 2. One of the inspection hatches on the top of the reservoir had no lock in place to prevent unauthorised access to the treated water reservoir.



Introduction

Thomastown Reservoir receives treated water from Ballycoolin Reservoir via Lissenhall and provides a booster chlorination dose on the inlet of Thomastown Reservoir. An additional booster chlorination dose can be provided on the outlet of the reservoir, if required. The reservoir serves Fingal Zone 1 public drinking water supply.

The audit was undertaken to assess Uisce Éireann's performance in producing clean and wholesome water with a focus on the alarms and inhibits in place on the booster chlorination and the procedures in place to ensure appropriate oversight of the chlorination process.

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Supply Zones Areas Inspected

The audit consisted of interviews with Uisce Éireann and an inspection of the dosing and validation infrastructure
