**AIR POLLUTION ACT 1987 LICENSING OF INDUSTRIAL PLANT**

Notice is hereby given that Roadstone Ltd. is applying to Kerry County Council for an Air Emissions Licence to operate an mobile black-top plant at their existing sand pit in the Townland of Glasheen, Kiharney, Co. Kerry. The plant is a batch-mix operation and comprises a single exhaust stack, industry approved dust emissions control system, aggregate feed bins, oil-fired aggregate dryer, bitumen mixing hopper with storage silos and hot storage bins with direct discharge of hot mix.
