

 - Exploring the potential impact of digital monitors to nudge action.









Borrowing a Digital Radon Monitor – What's it all about?

book.....





Reducing your radon levels

- EPA research shows that, of those that test high, only one in five reduce their radon exposure
- Of the 500 high homes tested in Wexford (about) 100 have remediated
- Primary objective: Invited those that have already tested above 200 Bq/m³ to borrow a monitor with their library card for 3-4 weeks
 - First testers!
 - Public Engagement + Awareness Raising



Use of the digital monitor

Digital monitors are useful:

- To get a quick snapshot of the radon levels in your home
- If you have already carried out a three-month (certified) test to confirm radon is still high, or
- Following remediation work, to confirm it has been successful


The results of these short tests are not a replacement for a three-month measurement (an indicative value)



Use of the digital monitor

Use of the digital monitor

- Use the monitor in either your kitchen or living room for loan period (3-4 weeks)
- Don't place the monitor on the ground, near a door or window or in a damp area
- After 3-4 weeks, record the long-term average reading on the monitor before returning it to the library (THE USER!)
- Library staff reset the monitor for next user (removing all records of your data)



- In Wexford: As a citizen scientist, they helped co-design and test a Do It Yourself (DIY) remediation toolkit working with the EPA and a radon remediation contractor.
 - Interlinked with a wider EU project (partners)
 - Project funding (support for remediation work)
 - 3-month tests (Pre & Post remediation)
 - Engagement & Awareness Raising
